HANDS-ON LEARNING: BUILDING SKILLS THROUGH EXPERIENCE



Over the past weeks, our classrooms have been alive with purposeful activities that encourage exploration and skill-building.

Children explored **arranging flowers, matching animals, and sound bottles**, which refined their sensory awareness and concentration. **Potato slicing for fries** gave them an opportunity to practice fine motor skills while learning about food preparation.

In the outdoor environment, they actively engaged in using **gardening tools, planting seeds, and picking up trash**, fostering care for nature. Practical life tasks like **sweeping, mopping, cleaning windows, and washing dishes and clothes** helped them build a sense of responsibility and order.

Activities like **bolts and nuts** encouraged logical thinking and hand-eye coordination, while **thermic tablets** deepened their sensory exploration. Beyond these, the children participated in other Montessori exercises like **sorting, pouring, spooning, threading, and stacking**, which lay a foundation for critical thinking and problem-solving.

These engaging tasks not only spark joy but also nurture confidence, focus, and autonomy, preparing children for success inside and outside the classroom.

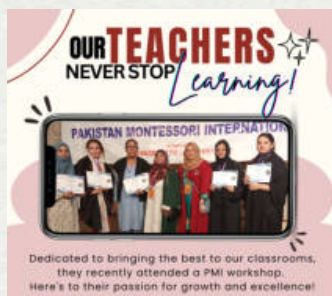
MEDICAL CAMP
