Learning in our classrooms takes place at the child's own pace, as we believe every child is unique and learns according to their individual needs and understanding. HANDS ON LEARNING

From August to October, our little explorers have been joyfully engaged in a wide variety of Montessori activities that spark curiosity and nurture a love for learning. The classrooms have been filled with excitement as children explored sandpaper letters and numbers, colour tablets, geometric solids, sound boxes, and many more engaging sensorial and practical life exercises.













They practiced pouring, polishing, folding, buttoning, washing dishes, and setting tables — learning to care for their environment and for themselves. Through these purposeful tasks, children are gradually developing independence, concentration, and coordination.

It is a delight to watch them focus deeply, repeat activities with enthusiasm, and celebrate small successes each day. Their growing confidence, gentle movements, and sense of responsibility reflect how beautifully they are absorbing the Montessori spirit, doing things "all by myself" with pride and joy.



Our young artists have been busy expressing their creativity through a variety of fun-filled art and craft activities from August to October. From finger printing on the Pakistan flag, and creating moon-and-star collages for Independence Day, making Defence Day badges, to celebrating Dr. Maria Montessori's birthday with a colourful cake collage, every activity has been a joyful learning experience.

Children explored different techniques like paper pasting, leaf stamping, sponge and finger painting, and collage work on themes such as apples, umbrellas, and army helmets. They also enjoyed matching and pasting shapes, exploring colour patterns, and creating with natural materials. These creative sessions not only enhance imagination and fine motor skills but also give children the joy of self-expression and the confidence to bring their ideas to life.







* SCIENCE EXPERIMENTS













Our young scientists had a wonderful time exploring the magic of science through a variety of hands-on experiments. From observing sound waves by shouting on salt, to creating floating marker drawings, and learning about germs with black pepper and soap, every activity sparked curiosity and excitement.

Children were amazed to see ice melting with powder and soap, milk fireworks, water illusions, and even a whirlpool with lemon! They also enjoyed discovering magic ink using turmeric and baking soda, watching colors travel through tissue, and exploring air pressure by filling water into a bottle through a straw.

These engaging experiments helped children observe cause and effect, ask questions, and experience the joy of scientific discovery, turning learning into a fun-filled adventure!



Spend a few moments each day simply listening to your child. Ask about what they enjoyed, what made them curious, or what they found challenging. When children feel heard, they learn to express themselves with confidence and develop stronger emotional intelligence.

Meaningful conversations strengthen the bond between parents and children. Instead of focusing only on right or wrong, talk about feelings, efforts, and experiences. A simple 'Tell me more' or 'How did that make you feel?' encourages open sharing and builds trust.

Children who are listened to grow up feeling respected and valued. They become better communicators, problem-solvers, and more empathetic individuals. So, take a few minutes every day to pause, connect, and truly listen, your attention is the greatest gift you can offer.
